

# Request for Information: Facilitation Services for the Multi-Jurisdictional Steering Committee

Request for Information (RFI) for facilitation services for the Multi-jurisdictional Steering Committee working to design strategies to best serve the needs of our unsheltered and substance-using relatives.

**Issue date:** August 12, 2025. The first review of submissions will be on August 22, 2025 (posted until filled).

### **Purpose**

The purpose of this Request for Information is to gather information from qualified individuals, organizations, or entities to provide facilitation services and active strategy coordination grounded in Indigenous values for a diverse multijurisdictional steering committee. The steering committee is comprised of urban Indigenous community leaders and leaders from the state, region, county, and city. The committee has collectively committed to using a collaborative approach in developing strategies for improving outcomes in Indigenous communities, with a focus on housing, mental health, and substance use (See: Social Determinants of Health).

This effort seeks to engage community members and stakeholders through an Indigenous-led approach to outreach, facilitation, and community partnerships in order to respond to and meet the needs of the Indigenous Community.

This RFI is not a solicitation for bids, nor does it represent a commitment to purchase. Information provided may be used to inform a potential future solicitation.

## **Scope of Work**

The anticipated scope includes, but is not limited to:

- Facilitation Services over a period of six (6) months, with the potential to extend services based on need and performance.
- Engagement with Native American communities, using Indigenous methodologies and cultural practices.
- Active strategy coordination led to Indigenous facilitation and embodied practices
- Setting a framework and practices for sustainable action.
- Develop a long-standing, coordinated response system.
- Facilitate a Native-led, regular action planning meeting to create a nimble delivery system using real-time data to expedite policies, practices, and systems change.
- Access to leadership and stakeholders at the state, regional, county, and city levels.



- Data access and agreements, including the ability to request and receive data from governmental agencies, enter into necessary data sharing agreements, and guidance on how community data is used.
- Documentation support, including but not limited to:
  - Meeting notes and documentation
  - o Public meeting notices
  - o Outreach material preparation
- Community Outreach and Partnerships, with a strong emphasis on:
  - o Sustainable relationship building with Native-led organizations
  - Engaging urban Native American residents in Minneapolis and the surrounding area
  - Respecting tribal sovereignty and cultural protocols

# **Expected Deliverables**

- A detailed facilitation plan using Indigenous methodologies
- An implementation plan for delivering the coordinated response plan
- A stakeholder engagement map and outreach strategy
- A plan for community meeting scheduling and documentation
- Monthly progress updates and a final summary report for creating the delivery system

#### **Budget**

Total available funding for this initiative is \$50,000 over a six-month period.

#### **Submission Instructions**

Interested respondents should submit the following information:

- Organization or individual background and qualifications
- Experience working with Indigenous communities, particularly in Minneapolis
- Approach to Indigenous facilitation, including culturally appropriate methods
- Proposed plan for community engagement and outreach
- Budget outline aligned with proposed services
- Examples of past relevant projects
- Any anticipated support or resources needed to fulfill the work
